Mid-winter greetings! After a challenging first half of February, thoughts are turning toward Lent and spring.

The Parish Board is currently working on a big project for Metropolitan Nathaneal, a church-wide survey called the Baseline Initiative. As the new leader of the Diocese, Metropolian Nathanael is looking to gather current and historical information about the 58 parishes in the diocese.

"The best way to prepare for the future is to have an objective and accurate picture of where we were in the past, and where we are today. To this end, the Baseline Committee seeks to collect and analyze fundamental information about the parish demographics, ministries, sacramental life and basic finances," says His Eminence Metropolitan Nathan.

According to His Eminence, the information gathered will improve understanding the current state of the Metropolis and also will provide important and useful information for the Metropolis of Chicago Strategic Planning Process.

Completed surveys are due March 4, 2019. We are currently taking bets on how many of the 58 parishes meet that dead-line! Based on great work by a number of people, we should be on time. Stay tuned!

GRACE EPISCOPAL HOMELESS SHELTER

Seven faithful volunteers from Assumption prepared, delivered and served a hot meal to 172 homeless men on Tuesday, January 29, at the Porchlight Inc. homeless shelter at Grace Episcopal Church, on the square in Madison. Volunteers included: Ilektra Kolokouri, Jane Schirmer, Korinna Hansen, Mike Smith, Scott Spevacek, Peter Cameron and Tom Cameron.

We are scheduled to prepare and serve a meal on four more Tuesdays during 2019. The dates are: April 30, July 30, October 29, and December 31. If you wish to help out please contact Ilektra Kolokouri or David Giffey.

The number of guests at the homeless shelter is always high during winter months when temperatures are low. But January 29 was in the middle of bitter cold temperatures of minus 30 degrees, plus wind chill. Schools, businesses, and events were canceled around Wisconsin, but the volunteer crew worked to provide food and warmth to homeless people. The number of homeless in need of food and warmth is very high this year in Madison.

Porchlight's emergency shelter operates with the support of 70 volunteer organizations and 1,200 people who provide two meals every day of the year to over one thousand individuals. A team of volunteers from Assumption Church has worked at the homeless shelter since it was founded in 1984. Since then, volunteers like those from Assumption at the men's shelter have prepared and served more than 25,000 meals to homeless men.

The Men's Drop-In Shelter is the only emergency shelter for single men experiencing homelessness in Dane County. In 2017, shelter services were provided to 1,153 men who were experiencing homelessness, serving approximately 80 men on a nightly basis in the summer and 150 to 190 men during the winter months. When demand becomes higher in the cold season, there are three shelter sites available: Grace Episcopal Church, Saint John's Lutheran Church, and First United Methodist Church.

The services for homeless people are provided by Porchlight through contributions. You can learn about Porchlight and make a donation through the website http://porchlightinc.org

Metropolis of Chicago Forms Young Professional Board to Advise the Metropolitan and the Metropolis Council

CHICAGO, IL, December 5, 2018 – The Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Chicago today announced an open invitation for young adults and emerging leaders, ages 21-40, to apply for the newly created Young Professional Advisory Board of the Metropolis.

The new initiative, conceived by His Eminence Metropolitan Nathanael, is intended to be an opportunity for young adults to participate in a leadership capacity for the benefit of the Metropolis.

Once established, the Metropolitan and Members of the Metropolis Council will relay on 24 individuals chosen from across the Metropolis for advice, consultation and feedback related to the business of the Metropolis. Advisory Board Members will participate in monthly meetings to discuss and review the initiatives of the Metropolis. In addition, four members of the Board will serve as ex officio non-voting members of the Metropolis Council and will participate in its regular meetings. All members will serve a two-year term.

"Diversity of opinion is important to us and we expect to benefit greatly from the creativity, perspective and energy of young adults of the Metropolis," His Eminence Metropolitan Nathanael said. "Since members of the Advisory Board will have my attention, and that of the Metropolis Council, I am confident this initiative will help build several, strong bridges between the current and future generations of leaders of the Metropolis."

The formation of the Young Professional Advisory Board follows the launch of the Roundtable program, which is designed to foster a long-term dialogue between Greek Orthodox young adults and the Metropolitan.




