Feed the Hungry

The National Philoptochos Feed the Hungry program is a story of dedication, commitment, and success of our Philoptochos ladies. It began as part of National Philoptochos President Maria Logus' goal of "doing more hands on philanthropy, engaging all members of our community in our work."

The challenge has been set by National each year since 2015 and in 2018: Philoptochos workers and stewards not only surpassed our goal of feeding one million meals, but we served 1,339,651 meals nationwide. Our own Metropolis of Chicago chapters served 227,814 meals and 36 chapters from our Metropolis participated in the program.

Our National President Maria Logus, seeing the tremendous success of our previous goals, has set the new goal to reach 1.5 million meals from July 2018 until we meet at the next Biennial Convention in July of 2020.

We continue to engage in this program through the work done by our Philoptochos chapter and parishioners for shopping, cooking and serving for the shelter at Grace Episcopal Church and the River Food Pantry. Congratulations to all who participate in continuing the work locally and contributing overall to the Feed the Hungry program.

Assumption volunteers continue to cook and serve meal at Grace Episcopal homeless shelter

Many thanks to the volunteers who cooked and those who served the meal on Tuesday, July 30 - only two days after Greek Fest. Volunteers from Assumption are scheduled to work at the homeless shelter at Grace Episcopal Church on the square every time there are five Tuesdays in a month. In 2019, our church has provided a hot meal and a crew of servers in January, April and July. Our turn will also come up on October 29, and December 31 (New Year's Eve).

Greek Fest this year was so close to July 30 that Ilektra Kolokouri, who leads the kitchen crew, relied on only two volunteer cooks to help her prepare the meal as we had pastitsio and chicken slouvakia left over from the festival: Jane Schirmer and Ilektra's friend and neighbor, Fernanda De Oliveira. If you are interested in helping with the meal for the homeless shelter October 29, please contact Ilektra. The usual meal - Greek-style chicken, rice, and green beans - is a favorite at the homeless shelter. The kitchen crew makes sure there is enough food so seconds can be served.

Mike Smith delivered the food from church to church. Mike also shopped for the extras like bread, milk, fruit, cheese, and cold cuts, which supplement the meal and can be used to pack lunches the for homeless people who go to jobs the next day. The serving crew on July 30, in addition to Mike, included Scott Spevacek, Peter Cameron, and Chris Schmidt.

We are truly grateful for the effort and generosity of the volunteer cooks and servers from Assumption Greek Orthodox Church who help the homeless at the drop-in shelter. Thanks also to Philoptochos for assisting with funds for the food extras.






