SAFETY COMMITTEE Updates

Working under the auspices of the Metropolis, the AGOC Safety Committee, completed the Youth Training Modules. In an effort to support all families and promote the love of Jesus and our chruch traditions, the Archdiocese of America instituted a safety protocol program. This program requires that ALL people working with anyone under the age of 18 receive training and submit to a background check. Critical take-aways of the program, we CAN NEVER be in a situation where the ratio is one-to-one (1 adult/1 minor). This means, if a Sunday School or Greek School has only one student, they must either cancel class or combine with another class.

Along with the Youth Safety Component we are also continuing to monitor and improve our church safety protocols for the community. The main entry to the church will remain closed until ushers arrive. Even then, the usher will be monitoring the door and locking the doors if needed. When we have evening activities, we should monitor the door and let people in as they arrive. Remember, while we want to welcome everyone we also want to ensure that people entering our home recognize that it is a place of worship.
