WHAT IS THE CHRISTMAS SPIRIT!

That most magical time of the year is once again fastly approaching. Children are getting excited, and most of us are out there shopping for that perfect gift. The stores have had their annual post Thanksgiving rush, and all of us know exactly how many shopping days there are until Christmas. We are being bombarded by ads telling us to get into the Christmas spirit. But, what is the Christmas Spirit? Most people would probably tell you it is about being with the ones they love, and the giving spirit that overtakes most of us during this time of the year. Children will tell you it is the thrill they get from opening presents on Christmas morning. Is this all the Christmas Spirit is, or is it something more?

I would say yes to the above question. I do believe that all those do fit into what we call the Christmas Spirit, but it is also so much more. Christmas means so much more to Orthodox Christians. It is the day when salvation entered the world. It is the day when Christ was brought into our world both fully human, and fully God. He humbled Himself for our sake. Most of us know what the Gospel's say about this most glorious event in our history. But do we truly understand the significance? When thinking of our Faith, most will quickly jump to the most important aspect being the Resurrection, and they are correct. But, if it were not for the Nativity, there would never have been a Resurrection. We see the joyousness of the angels in the second chapter of the Gospel of Luke, where the angels are singing hymns of Praise toward the birth of Christ into the world. "Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men". They knew, as we do now, that at that very moment salvation had arrived.

What is society teaching our children about this day? What are we doing to educate our own children about Christmas? Society every year seems to take a step in the wrong direction. It boggles my mind that we have to watch what we say, in case we were to wish the wrong person Merry Christmas. Now it has become popular to use the term "Seasons Greetings" or "Happy Holidays". What shocks me even more is that we allow society to sway us, and we have grown accustom to saying this ourselves. Last year I put some serious thought into this very subject, and I myself, have begun to use during the Christmas season the term "Christ is Born". It is similar to what we say during the season following Pascha. We all know to say "Christ is Risen" to which we respond "Truly he has Risen". So when we utter the phrase "Christ is Born" we answer "Glorify Him". This is how we should be greeting one and other this advent season. Many will ask can this greeting be used before Christmas, and I tell you yes, because it is in November at the feast of the Entry of the Theotokos to the Temple, that we begin to sing the Katavasies of Christmas. Which begin, "Christ is Born, Glorify Him". By doing this we are taking our faith, and declaring it to those we meet. We must not be ashamed of our faith, but instead be ready to proclaim it to all that want to listen, and this is best done through our actions. As we all know" actions speak louder than words". So I humbly ask all of you to remember the true meaning of this joyous time of the year, and keep Christ at the center of your thoughts.

- + Countless angels are shown doing the many works that we are all called to do as God's creation.
- + These works include worshipping God, offering their service, singing hymns of praise, and announcing the Good News of His birth.



+ They come through the barren wilderness...a reminder of the inhospitable world as it has been since man was expelled from Paradise.



- + St. Joseph the Betrothed is seen at a distance from the central image of the Panagia and her Child, reinforcing that he is not the father of the Newborn.
- + He faces out into the darkness troubled with doubts about Christ's Virgin Birth.
- + In some icons, he is shown listening to an old, bent man representing the Evil One, who makes these troubling suggestions.



Frequently Asked Questions

How do I become a member of the parish?

Membership in the Orthodox Church begins at baptism (Chrismation for some) and continues throughout our life. We are united with Christ through the sacraments, or mysteries, of the Church and through our faithful offering of our entire selves to Jesus Christ. Our Archdiocese requires each parish to distinguish between voting members and non-voting members. A voting member is over 18 years of age and turns in a signed stewardship commitment card, committing a portion of time, talent and treasure to the Church. The Archdiocese also requires the voting member to remain current through the year on their commitments. Keep in mind that true membership in the Body of Christ involves living according to His word and within His Church.

Why must I commit to give a specific amount?

Please keep in mind that your stewardship of money is kept in the strictest of confidence. However, we do compile the amounts anticipated to better plan our budget.

What if I cannot fulfill my stewardship commitment?

During the course of a year, circumstances change. Your stewardship is valued because it is made out of your love for God and His Church. Please do not be concerned if you are unable to meet your stewardship commitment – we are glad you are a part of this parish.



STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE

2022 STEWARDSHIP COMMITMENT: Assumption Greek Orthodox Church depends on the love and gratitude of its members in order to perform its sacred ministry. Each member is asked to support the church by annually setting his or her own level of giving, in proportion to his or her earnings. This year, we ask you to search your heart and conscience, and to seriously consider the many needs of our Church, as you determine your Stewardship Pledge of Commitment for 2022.

Your giving should be a profound spiritual action, coming as an expression of your love and gratitude to God and his church, which blesses you and your family, and preserves and cultivates our Orthodox Christian Faith. To be meaningful, your Stewardship Commitment should not be simply a token offering from your surplus resources, but should be a true sacrifice, giving a feeling that "I gave something valuable in order to help my Church," a GOOD FEELING.

Our 2022 Parish Budget is counting on drawing \$160,000 from Stewardship. This represents about 2/3 of our anticipated expenses. Please realize that every Stewardship Pledge of Commitment should represent conscientious support of our Church for ONE FULL YEAR! To meet our expenses, Assumption needs an average of \$1,9606 to be able to survive on stewardship alone. So you can see how important your contribution is! Some stewards can give more than this; some will give less. We are hoping that every steward of our parish can try to raise their stewardship for the year. Just like we get a cost of living increase through work, so do the expenses of the church go up each year. We need to be mindful to try and increase our giving by at least a bit every year. We know that giving certain amounts can seem dauting over time when you are only looking at the final number. Many people would like to give \$1,000, \$1,500 or even \$2,000 a year for stewardship. But that number can seem overwhelming. The best thing we can do is to try and break down those numbers to more manageable expectations. Do you know that setting aside \$20 a week for stewardship will mean at the end of the year you will have given \$1,040 in Stewardship. \$30 a week makes an offering of \$1,560 at the end of the year. And \$40 a week makes it \$2,080 for the year. We know not everyone can do this, and that is ok.

Try your best and God will provide.
