

#### GROWING IN OUR FAITH

Another New Year has come and gone, and we all find ourselves with a slew of New Year resolutions. Hopefully we have been vigilant and sticking to our plan. But a question now must be raised. Of all the resolutions we made, how many entail living a more Christ-centered life? How many involved helping those around us in need? How many are to grow in our faith?

We have come to know that life is all about making ourselves better, losing weight, reading more etc. But as we all remember from our days as students, in order to get better you must study. An athlete spends hours practicing and training in order to become the best. Of course God given talent does play a role in things, but as people we were all given the ability to be saints, but it is only those who put an effort into their faith that can truly excel. To put your all into your faith requires more then just going to Church every Sunday, and taking communion. Although those are definitely two steps in the right direction, growing in faith involves a lot more then just that.

A solid first step for growing in our faith is to read the Bible everyday. To many people this seems like a burden, but if one reads a couple of chapters a day, one will be able to read the whole New Testament in one year. Scriptural reading will help in your understanding of not only Christ's ministry, but also will give you an understanding of the early church. It also gives you a better understanding of the Liturgy. We as Orthodox have our Liturgies plucked out of scripture. Everything that is done in Church has a scriptural basis, and knowing God's word will cultivate your faith by leaps and bounds.

Another very good way to strength your faith is through the act of prayer. There are many different prayers in the Orthodox Church for every possible occasion. One of the most popular little prayer services is the Compline. In Greek in means "prayer after dinner". It is a wonderful prayer that is said in the evening before you go to bed. It only takes about 10 minutes to say, and the whole family can participate. Besides just this in most prayer books you can find Evening prayers, which are a bit shorter then a compline service, but still offer a lot to anyone. Try to say prayers before and after meals, just to give thanks for all the blessings God has bestowed upon you.

Prayer books are readily available in both Greek and English. Most Orthodox bookstores have a great selection of prayer books appropriate for all people.

There are many more ways that we all can strengthen our faith, but the most important one is plain and simple. We must want to actually grow closer to God. Although He is always there and ready to help us along our path, He can do nothing if we do not want it. It reminds me of the popular painting we see with Christ knocking on a door. Now the question is, will we open the door?

#### NATIONAL PHILOPTOCHOS SOCIETY PROGRAMS AND MINISTRY COMMITMENTS

Saint Basil Academy - Vasilopita Fund (January 2023)

Saint Basil Academy - Sisterhood of Saint Basil Academy Fund (April 2023)

In March 1944, Archbishop Athenagoras recommended that the Philoptochos Society purchase the 250-acre Rupert Estate in Garrison, New York, located on the shores of the Hudson River, directly across from the United States Military Academy at West Point. With that purchase, and with the establishment of the Academy of St. Basil, Philoptochos undertook the lasting commitment to the children who reside there. Today, Philoptochos remains a major financial supporter of the Academy through two ministry commitments:

- <u>Vasilopita</u>: Held in January by every chapter in the United States, this event provides a major source of funding for the Academy's operating expenses.
- <u>Sisterhood</u>: The Sisterhood Fund provides for the ongoing needs of the children of the Academy, such as clothing, furnishings, equipment and other essentials for the dormitories and kitchens, as well as support for the Graduation ceremonies and special awards for students.

#### Social Services Fund – January 2023 Cancer and Other Major Illnesses Fund – January 2023

Following the recommendations of Archbishop Iakovos, Philoptochos has, since the late 1950s, focused on the implementation of important programs to benefit the Greek Orthodox community, including but not limited to the institutions of the church, but also programs assisting Orthodox families.

Since 1987, the National Philoptochos Office has employed a licensed Social Worker to assist the Greek Orthodox community in the United States, as well as Greek and Cypriot nationals. The Department of Social Services is a critical and vital component of the Society. The mission of the Department is to improve the quality of life of those in need, in a way that maintains the dignity and self-respect of the individual. Through confidential and professional services, the office provides outreach, education, information, support, motivation, advocacy, financial assistance, and referrals to local and broader resources.

As uncovered medical costs continue to be a key concern in the United States, the Philoptochos cancer and other major illnesses fund provides relief to members of our community, regardless of immigration status, so that they can focus on their health and health care needs rather than their financial challenges.

#### Autism Assistance Fund – February 2023

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention has called Autism a "national public health crisis" more common than pediatric cancer, diabetes and AIDS combined. This fund provides assistance and support to persons within the Autism spectrum and promotes education to heighten Autism awareness.

#### Saint Photios Shrine Fund – February 2023

In 1965, the Archdiocese purchased the Avero House in historic Saint Augustine, Florida, to commemorate the arrival of the first Greek settlers in the New World in 1768. Philoptochos continues its commitment to provide financial assistance towards the preservation of the National Shrine.

#### Orthodox Christian Missions Fund—March 2023 Support a Mission Priest Fund—March 2023

The Society offers financial assistance to Orthodox Christian Mission organizations, strengthening their ability to carry the message of the Orthodox Church through media and missions, throughout the world. In addition, the Support a Mission Priest ministry enables Orthodox bishops and priests in mission areas to build and restore churches, community centers, schools, and medical facilities, and to participate in training, teaching and field management.

#### Hellenic College/Holy Cross School of Theology Lenten Event Fund – March 2023 Hellenic College/Holy Cross School of Theology Scholarship Fund – September 2023

Archbishop Athenagoras established the Holy Cross School of Theology in June 1937, in Pomfret, Connecticut. The Archbishop addressed a special appeal to the Philoptochos to devote themselves to the School, "where your sons will be educated as priests and teachers." Over eighty five years later, Philoptochos continues its strong commitment to and financial support of Hellenic College/Holy Cross through the following programs:

- <u>HCHC Lenten Event Fund</u>: On the Third Sunday of Lent, observing the Veneration of the Holy Cross, Philoptochos chapters sponsor a Lenten Event, following the Divine Liturgy, with proceeds dedicated to operating expenses of the school.
- <u>HCHC Scholarship Fund</u>: Scholarships are awarded to worthy and dedicated students, both men and women at Hellenic College and seminarians at Holy Cross to assist with tuition expenses.

#### International Orthodox Christian Charities (IOCC) Fund - April 2023

The IOCC is the humanitarian aid agency of Orthodox Christians, providing food, shelter, economic selfsufficiency, and hope to those in need around the world. Philoptochos partners with IOCC to serve as first responders to major world disasters through and for education, health, and major necessities.

#### 75th Anniversary Founders Fund – May/June 2023

Celebrating the 75th Anniversary of the Philoptochos Society, this fund provides financial support to Greek Orthodox older adults and their families to assist with housing, utilities, unreimbursed or uncovered medical expenses, home health care, hospice, funerals, safety equipment, and specially approved projects and also provides support to existing continuing care facilities serving the aging Greek Orthodox population in the United States, and may support the establishment of similar facilities.

#### Orthodox Christian Fellowship Fund (OCF) - May/June 2023

The OCF mission is to support fellowship on college campuses, whose members experience and witness the Orthodox Church through community life, prayer, service to others and study of faith. The fund provides support to more than 240 local OCF chapters throughout the country.

#### Retired Clergy/Widowed Presvyteres Benevolent Fund – September 2023

Through this commitment, Philoptochos provides support for the Retired Clergy and Widowed Presvyteres of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America which was established in 1988 to provide support for retired clergy who face financial challenges.

#### National Philoptochos Emergency Fund – October 2023

This fund enables the Philoptochos Society to immediately respond to those in need in times of national or international crisis.

#### Ecumenical Patriarchate Fund – November 2023

The philanthropies of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, such as Baloukli Hospital and nursing home, schools, shrines, and parishes, are supported through this commitment.

#### APC-NSP Benevolent Fund – November 2023

The National Sisterhood of Presvyteres was established in 1982 and is comprised of all Presvyteres of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. Philoptochos funds provide short-term support for clergy and/or their families in times of crisis.

#### <u>United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF)</u> – December 2023

In 1979, to commemorate the United Nation's "International Year of the Child." Philoptochos was designated a Non-Governmental Organization, working with the United Nations and UNICEF. Philoptochos' donations help this global organization protect the rights, health, and well-being of children worldwide.

#### General Medical Fund – December 2023

Philoptochos receives numerous requests for financial assistance for adults afflicted with medical conditions which are outside the scope of restricted funds established by the Society. The Society utilizes this fund to aid in those cases where appropriate funding is not otherwise available.



## The Presentation of Christ in the Temple February 2

#### The meeting of our Lord — the Light and Life of Mankind!

- + The location shown in the icon is the Temple.
- + God Himself had commanded that all Jewish newborns be presented to the Temple 40 days after childbirth.



- + The Panagia and St. Joseph bring the Christ Child to sanctify and dedicate Him to God, in keeping with the law.
- + Jesus Christ, Who is God from before all time, humbles Himself not only to be born as a Child, but chooses to be born into a life of earthly poverty!
- + St. Joseph the Betrothed and the Panagia were too poor to offer a sacrificial lamb at the Temple, so they offered two turtle doves as the custom provided.
- + St. Anna the Prophetess had lived in the Temple day and night for decades, fasting, praying, and awaiting the Messiah.
- + On seeing Him, she praises God and
  "speaks about the Child to all who sought
  the redemption of Jerusalem" (Luke 2: 38).



- + Jesus Christ, Who is God before all ages, is presented to the Temple as any other child of a poor Jewish family of the time.
- + His true poverty is less an issue of being born into a poor family, and more that He assumed our human nature for the benefit of mankind.
- + St. Gregory the Theologian says, "while He was rich, He became poor so that we might become rich with His divinity."
- + Christ is held by St. Simeon, a righteous man, referred to as the "God-receiver."
- + He recognizes the Infant to be the long-awaited Messiah, and declares Him "a light to lighten the Gentiles and the Glory of His people, Israel."
- + The Holy Spirit revealed Christ to Sts. Simeon and Anna due to their piety and steadfastness in seeking Him, as we are called to do.
- + St. Simeon prophecies to the Panagia of both her Son's great ministry and of heartache she will endure, foretelling of Christ's Crucifixion for our sake.
