YOUR COOPERATION IS NEEDED: We remind our faithful that the Divine Liturgy begins at 9:45 a.m. Sharp! On Sunday. **Please be prompt and on time!** Please turn off cell phones before entering church. No conversation should take place during worship. During the reading of the Gospel people in the narthex should not be purchasing or lighting candles but standing reverently and listen to the reading. If possible avoid using center aisle during high points of Divine Liturgy. Lipstick and lip-gloss should be removed before kissing icons, receiving Holy Communion and kissing the hand of the priest. Please keep the Center aisle clear for the ushers and wait until they dismiss your row. Please avoid standing right behind the ushers we do not want anyone tripping over a child. When receiving antidoron, please use both hands and do not allow the crumbs to fall to the floor.

CHUCKLE: If you want to be well liked, never lie about yourself, and be careful when telling the truth about others.

The reading is from Paul's Letter to the Galatians

Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

For what can a man give in return for his life? For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

At the same time, we warmly welcome all non-Orthodox to join us in prayer and celebration, and humbly offer to all present the Antidoro bread of fellowship at the end of the service. We offer this important symbol 'instead of the Gifts', in the words of the Apostle Paul, 'Till we all come to the unity of the Faith' (Eph. 4.13).

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE PARENTS' ATTITUDE TOWARD CHURCH AND SUNDAY SCHOOL

The parent's attitude toward Church and Sunday Church School is crucial. There are parents who are habitually late for Church. The result is that children miss part or most of the Church School lesson. The continuity of the lesson is destroyed. The class is continually interrupted by late-comers. The teacher becomes frustrated. But even more important is what happens to the student. The child knows that for important things one has to be on time, public school for example. The habit of coming to church and Sunday Church School late teaches the child that God is not as important as public school, piano lessons, or sports for which one has to be on time.

Another example is the attitude of the parents towards coming to church on Sunday. It doesn't take much for some parents to stay away from church; just a tiny bit of rain will do it. But parents never stay away from work on Monday morning because of rain. So the child's mind learns that work is more important than God. For that matter, almost anything is more important than God. Is it a wonder, then, that the children grow up to adopt a system of values that leaves God out entirely?

Punctuality and faithful attendance at church impress upon children the importance of God and of our Orthodox Christian value system.

SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM ON THE CROSS: St. John Chrysostom offered the following encomium on the Cross of Jesus:

The Cross has dissolved hatred towards man, has brought reconciliation, has made the earth heaven, has mingled men with the angels, has conquered the bastion of death, as neutralized the strength of the devil, has dismissed the power of sin, has rid the earth of error, has restored the truth, has driven away the demons, has torn down pagan temples, has upset sacrificial altars, has dispelled the smell of burnt offerings, has planted virtue, has founded churches.

The Cross is the Will of the Father, the Glory of the Son, the Joy of the Spirit, the Pride of Paul.

The Cross is brighter than the sun and gayer than its ray.

The Cross has town our mortgage, has rendered useless the prison of death.


The Cross is proof of the love of God, the unshaken wall, the unconquered weapon, the security of the rich, the richness of the poor, the weapon of the threatened, the rebuke of the passions, the kingdom of virtue, the wonderful and strange sign.
