for a while and in time of temptation fall away. And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. And as for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience." As he said these things, he cried out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

THE SEVENTH ECUMENICAL COUNCIL: Was convened by Emperor Constantine VI and his mother, Empress Irene the Athenian (780-802) at Nicea of Asia Minor (the same place as the First Ecumenical Council) in 787 AD. It was attended by 348 to 367 Fathers of the Church. Pope Adrian I of Rome (717-795) was also represented. The Council dealt with the Iconoclastic (down with the icons) Controversy. It started with Emperor Leo Isaurus (717-741) who in trying to stop the masses from worshipping the icons, issued a decree in 726 that they should be raised high up in the churches so that the people could not reach them. This decree was followed by a harsher one in 730 that the icons should be removed entirely from the churches. A violent reaction followed this decree. Champion of the friends of the icons was St. John of Damascus who, in defending the holy icons, quoted St. Basil who said that, "the honor which is given to the icon passes over to the prototype" i.e. the person represented by the icon. He also added that the icons help us, "to imitate their virtues and to glorify God". According to St. John, the icons should serve as a monument to the acts of heroism of the Saints. He further stated that, this (veneration of the icons) is an unwritten tradition, much as the veneration of the Cross.

In the controversy countless works of art were deliberately destroyed by fire and very much blood was shed. The people were divided into friends of the icons (iconophiles) and foes of the icons (iconoclasts). Emperor Constantine Copronymus (741-775), who succeeded Leo Isaurus convened a pseudo-council against the icons which made the situation much worse. Finally the Seventh Ecumenical Council (787) allowed the people to use holy icons declaring that they should render to them only honor and not worship, which belongs only to God.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT: There's an old Japanese legend according to which a pious Buddhist monk died and went to heaven. He was taken to a place where there were piled and labeled on shelves what looked like dried mushrooms. On closer examination, he saw they were actually human ears. Upon inquiring he discovered that they were the ears of people who on earth went diligently to the temple, listened with pleasure to the teaching of the gods, yet did nothing about what they heard so that after death they themselves went elsewhere and only their ears were saved. Only their ears reached heaven.

How often have we heard the complaint that we church people are mostly ears, that we go to church and nothing comes of it, that we substitute hearing for doing and call that serving God. It is a complaint that is painfully true. It has caused great crop failures for Christianity through the ages. "He who has ears to hear, let him hear." Let him roll up his sleeves, pick up a hoe, plow the soil, pull up the weeds and stones and prepare to bear rich fruit for Christ!
