A SPECIAL LITANY: For the Veneration of the Holy Cross will take place to-day towards the end of the Divine Liturgy. A tray of flowers, bearing a Cross, is taken by the priest in procession around the church. During the procession, the people kneel and sing the hymn "Ayios O Theos – Holy is God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on ." After circling the church, the tray is placed on a table in the middle of the solea. As the priest intones the words "Sophia Orthoi – Wisdom, let us be attentive" the people stand. Then the hymn of the day "O Lord save Thy people" is sung by the priest and congregation. After this the people bow their heads and are blessed by the priest as the hymn "Your Cross we venerate, O Lord, and your Holy Resurrection we glorify" is being sung. At the conclusion of the Liturgy the faithful come and venerate the Cross and receive a flower. The flower symbolizes that it is the Cross of Jesus that brings new life, in sublime beauty and fragrance, making every true believer "the aroma of Christ to God among those who are being saved" (2 Corinthians 2:15).

FOOD FOR THE NEEDY - Please help the needy and bring non-perishable food items for the Food Pantry. SACRAMENT OF HOLY CONFESSION: As we begin the Lenten Period on our Journey towards Pascha, we should all prepare for the Resurrection of our Lord by partaking of the Sacrament of Holy Confession. Make an appointment with your Spiritual Father. For details, see Fr. Christodoulos.

COMMUNION ANNOUNCEMENT: While we pray and work for the reconciliation and unity of all the world's Christians, the reality remains that there is still no intercommunion between our Orthodox Churches and the Churches of the West. This means that only baptized, chrismated and observant Orthodox faithful receive Communion in our churches. At the same time, we warmly welcome all non-Orthodox to join us in prayer and celebration, and humbly offer to all present the Antidoro bread of fellowship at the end of the service. We offer this important symbol 'instead of the Gifts', in the words of the Apostle Paul, 'Till we all come to the unity of the Faith' (Eph. 4.13).

Brethren, since we have a high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. For every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. Because of this he is bound to offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not take the honor upon himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."

And he said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

MARCH 25 – THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE THEOTOKOS: Visualize, if you will for a moment, the Iconostasion of an Orthodox Church. Facing the altar, you will recall the icon of Saint Michael at the left door, and the icon of Saintt Gabriel at the right door. Both doors have icons of the two most important events in history. It was the Archangel Michael who was sent by God to have Adam and Eve leave Paradise. And it was the Archangel Gabriel who was sent by God to the Blessed Virgin Mary to announce that she would give Birth to the Christ Child, Who would save the world.

This second event, the Annunciation (announcement) took place almost 2000 years ago. The Angel found her and told her she was going to have a child. Naturally, she was alarmed at first and asked many questions. "Do not be afraid," said the Angel Gabriel, "the Lord is with you because God has chosen you among all the women in the world and in history."

Mary could have said "no" or given a whole list of reasons why she did not wish to accept God's invitation. But instead, she said, "Let it be according to the will of God." She allowed herself to be an instrument of God. She did not change nor did she become a robot or machine. She let the Holy Spirit come within her and her life. She let God bless her and guide her. She let the Baby Jesus be born of her. The Feast Day of the Annunciation is a very important holiday for all Christians, because with the acceptance of the Blessed Virgin Mary, all of mankind had a chance to be saved. In the Orthodox Church we have hymns and prayers which remind us of this important event. The Blessed Virgin Mary, Theotokos, as scripture proclaimed, is held in high esteem by all Orthodox Christians.

THE VENERATION OF THE HOLY CROSS - AN EMBLEM OF VICTO-

RY: In the midst of devastation, suffering and death as symbolized by the Cross, the Church places flowers to prepare us for the vision of the Resurrection. As Bishop Kallistos Ware writes, "The dominant note on this Sunday, as on the two Sundays preceding, is one of joy and triumph. In the Orthros of this day, we sing the same hymn as at Easter midnight, 'This is the day of Resurrection...' and the troparia are in part a paraphrase of the Paschal Canon by St. John of Damascus. No separation is made between Christ's death and His Resurrection, but the Cross is regarded as an emblem of victory and Glogotha is seen in the light of the Empty Tomb."

The dominant hymn for the third Sunday of Lent: "We venerate Your Cross, O Lord, and we glorify your Holy Resurrection" is derived from the Orthros services of Easter Sunday: "Having witnessed the Resurrection of the Cross..." This same prayer is part of the regular Sunday Orthros service. Thus, the Cross and the Resurrection are kept together in Orthodox worship. We are encouraged to look beyond the Cross to see the glory of the Resurrection and the joy of eternal life.
