This means that only baptized, chrismated and observant Orthodox faithful receive Communion in our churches. At the same time, we warmly welcome all non-Orthodox to join us in prayer and celebration, and humbly offer to all present the Antidoro bread of fellowship at the end of the service. We offer this important symbol 'instead of the Gifts', in the words of the Apostle Paul, 'Till we all come to the unity of the Faith' (Eph. 4.13).

YOUR COOPERATION IS NEEDED: We remind our faithful that the Divine Liturgy begins at 9:45 a.m. Sharp! On Sunday. Please be prompt and on time! Please turn off cell phones before entering church. No conversation should take place during worship. During the reading of the Gospel people in the narthex should not be purchasing or lighting candles but standing reverently and listen to the reading. If possible avoid using center aisle during high points of Divine Liturgy. Lipstick and lip-gloss should be removed before kissing icons, receiving Holy Communion and kissing the hand of the priest. Please keep the Center aisle clear for the ushers and wait until they dismiss your row. Please avoid standing right behind the ushers we do not want anyone tripping over a child. When receiving antidoron, please use both hands and do not allow the crumbs to fall to the floor.

Therefore come out from them, and be separate from them, says the Lord, and touch nothing unclean; then I will welcome you, and I will be a father to you, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."

Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit, and make holiness perfect in the fear of God.

JESUS SPEAKS TO AVERAGE PEOPLE: In the Gospel lesson today Jesus asked those who stood about Him the penetrating question: "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again." You see, His disciples had never failed to do their duty. They had never fallen below the measure of what was required of them, but they had never gone beyond it. There was no measure of abundance in what they did, the kind that prompts people to say appreciatively, "You didn't have to do this." They were doing what everybody else was doing. They were average. They were loving those who loved them.

We, today, do the same thing. Look at the churches of Christ where the love of Jesus should find its highest expression. Christians often shower their love only on their friends. Jesus comes to challenge us: "Why only to your friends? Doesn't even the 'average' non-Christian do the same? What do you do more than others?"

"Well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Master." These words will be uttered on the last day not to the "average" people who loved those who loved them. They will be spoken to the "above average" who reached out to share with their enemies the love they had received from Jesus.

FROM THE FATHERS: "Humility is acquired after struggles. When you know yourself you acquire humility, which become a (permanent) condition. Otherwise one can become humble for a moment, but your thought will say to you that you are something although in reality you're nothing. and you'll be deluded like that to the moment of death. If death finds you with the thought that you are nothing, then God will speak. If however your thought says at the hour of death that you are something and you don't understand it, all your effort goes to waste." – Elder Paisios of the Holy Mountain




